

What is the DPCA Facebook Group?

The DPCA Facebook Group is a private site created for DPCA members to allow them to share photos and communicate with other members.

The group was created as a safe place for members to:

- Share photographs and related ideas with the members
- Ask for assistance with a problem shooting or processing a photograph
- Ask for comments on or experience with software or equipment.
- Sell or trade equipment
- Share notice of upcoming events such as lectures
- Share information that may be of interest to the members such as a vendor special

Do I need to sign up for a Facebook account, before joining the DPCA group?

Yes, you must have your own Facebook account before you can join the DPCA one. If you don't have a Facebook account, you can create one in a few simple steps:

1. Go to www.facebook.com.
2. If you see the signup form, fill out your name, email address or phone number, password, birthday and gender. If you don't see the form, click on **Sign Up**, then fill out the form.
3. Click **Sign Up**.

Once you sign up, you'll need to confirm your email or phone number.

If you already have a Facebook account, you can log into your account by entering your email or mobile number and password and clicking **Log In**.

Where do I find the DPCA Facebook group and how do I join it?

Open your Facebook page.

Search for "Digital Photography Club" in the search bar on your page. In the group header, click **Join Group**.

You will receive acknowledgment within a couple of days, if your dues are paid.

How do I post to the DPCA Facebook Group?

The top box on the group page is for adding information to the group

Click on **Write Post** to add text. If you want a constructive critique of your pictures, include the words “CC welcome.”

Click on **Add photo/video** to post your pictures.

Click on **Post** to complete your post.

What are the guidelines for posting to the DPCA Facebook Group?

Limit your post to one or two pictures. Please use Flickr or another social media site to post your travelogues.

Large posts will be removed.

Comment about your pictures(s) and include basic technical info (for example, the camera you used, the lens, your settings, etc.)

Do not correct and repost any member’s photograph, unless you are asked to do so. Anyone “fixing” another member’s photograph will be dropped from the page.

Please do not post your version of the same or a similar subject within another member’s post. Although you may be trying to be helpful by sharing your experience of the same event and/or your unique artistic view of the subject, your posting may be seen as rude or an unsolicited critique of the original poster’s work.

When asked to critique a picture with a “CC welcome” note, please be constructive. Our goal is to help members grow, not embarrass them.
