The Red Cross is looking for on-call photographers to support the Greater Chesapeake Region Communications Team. The mission is to improve the visibility of American Red Cross in the community and raise awareness about the good work of the organization. You'll shoot Red Cross events, disaster scenes (usually house fires), and other activities. The minimum commitment is for 24 hours a month (3 shifts in 8-hour blocks, 6 shifts in 4-hour blocks, one 24-hour block, etc.). You can choose your own shifts throughout a given month. During a shift, you may be called zero times, or you may be called three or more times, depending on the number of fires in the area during your shift, but you have to be ready to respond. You must have experience photographing people and events and own your camera (not a cell phone camera). You'll be asked to submit sample photography upon an interview with the Regional Communications Director. If selected, you'll receive one-on-one training with the Regional Communications Director. The appointment is for 6+ months.
